Combine Traditional Counselor Education with a Holistic Perspective

The 48-credit holistic counseling program is designed to prepare professionals with counseling skills that incorporate holistic perspectives into their work. Consonant with the mission of the University, the program seeks to help students learn and understand how to observe, evaluate, and incorporate the integration of body, mind, and spirit into their professional lives. Holistic counselors in training are presented with the idea that personal and system wholeness depends upon connectedness with the human community and with the natural world that supports it.

Through a holistic, social justice, and developmental perspective, this 48-credit Master of Arts program trains students to work in various settings utilizing traditional counseling techniques and systems thinking with awareness of neuroscience and

evidence-supported integrative practices.

Students in this program engage in coursework that is both didactic and interactive, and also complete a 150-hour supervised practicum. Upon completion of this degree, graduates



who wish to sit for the mental health licensing examination in Rhode Island may apply to the Certificate in Advanced Graduate Studies in Clinical Mental Health: Concentration in Holistic Counseling program. This is a 12-credit program designed to help students reach the 60-credit eligibility requirement.

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Admissions Requirements

Individuals with a bachelor's degree in any undergraduate major from a regionally accredited college or university (or an equivalent degree from an accredited institution outside of the United States) may apply to this program.

Application materials are submitted online at salve.edu/grad. There is no fee to apply. Salve Regina University evaluates the total application package; you must submit the following to be considered:

- Completed graduate application
- Official transcripts from each college/ university attended
- Personal statement
- Two professional letters of recommendation
- Resume
