**Bus Departure Time:** 11 a.m. (from Rodgers Recreation Center)


**Lunch:** Participants may choose from a variety of local lunch spots including Panera Bread, Uno and Asian options upon arrival (not included in trip fee).

If you are fascinated with American Indian history, the Pequot Museum in our own backyard is not to be missed. It rivals some of the best Native American museums in the country. This museum tells the history of the area, ancestors and neighbors in an interactive setting that creates a fabulous adventure!

Tribally owned-and-operated since it opened on Aug. 11, 1998, the museum brings to life the story of the Mashantucket Pequot Tribal Nation. It serves as a major resource on the histories and cultures of Native Americans in the northeast and on the region's rich natural history. Multi-sensory dioramas and exhibits introduce visitors to the history of the Mashantucket Pequot Tribe and the natural and cultural history of the eastern woodlands. Films and videos, interactive programs, archival materials, ethnographic and archaeological collections, commissioned art, and traditional crafts by Native artisans are featured in the exhibits.
