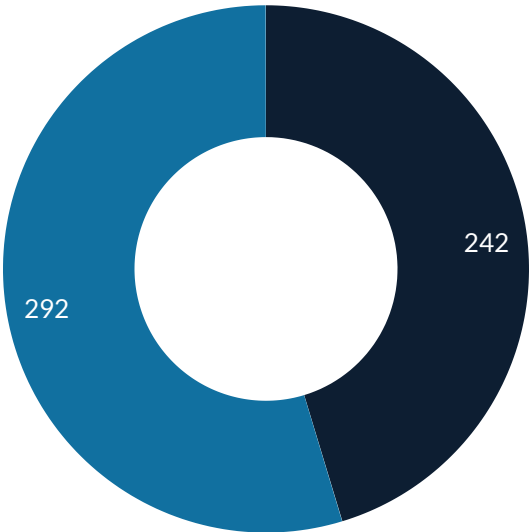

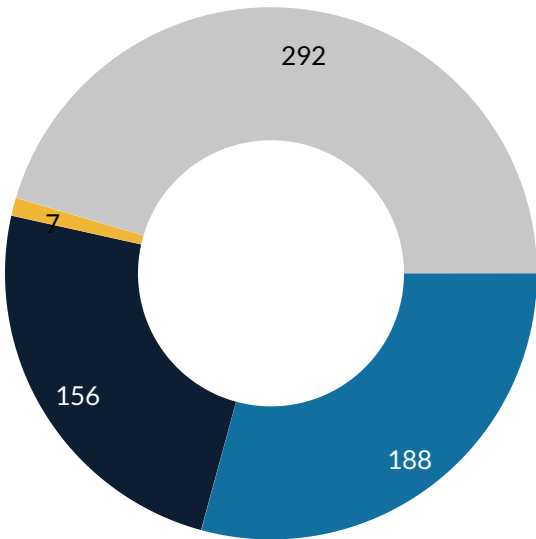

APPOINTMENTS BY SEMESTER



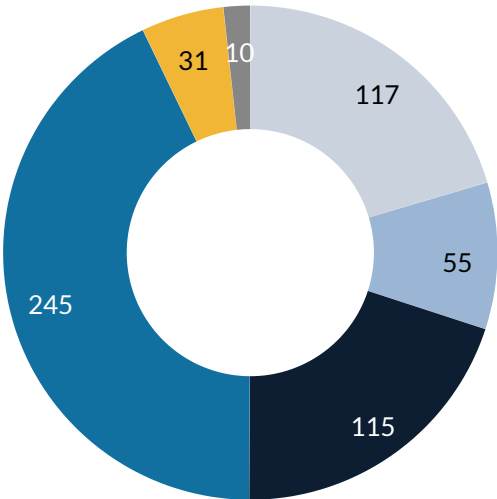

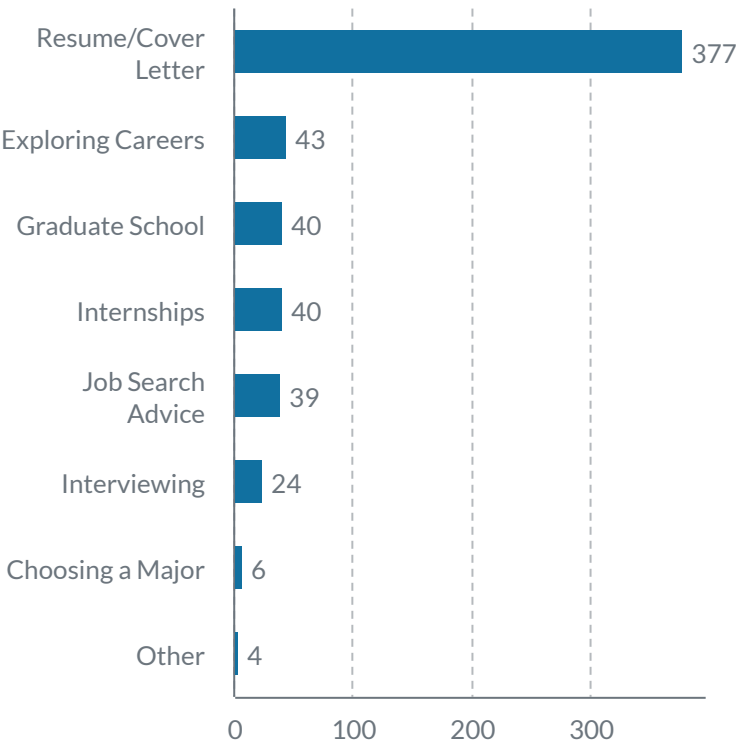
APPOINTMENTS BY CLASS YEAR*

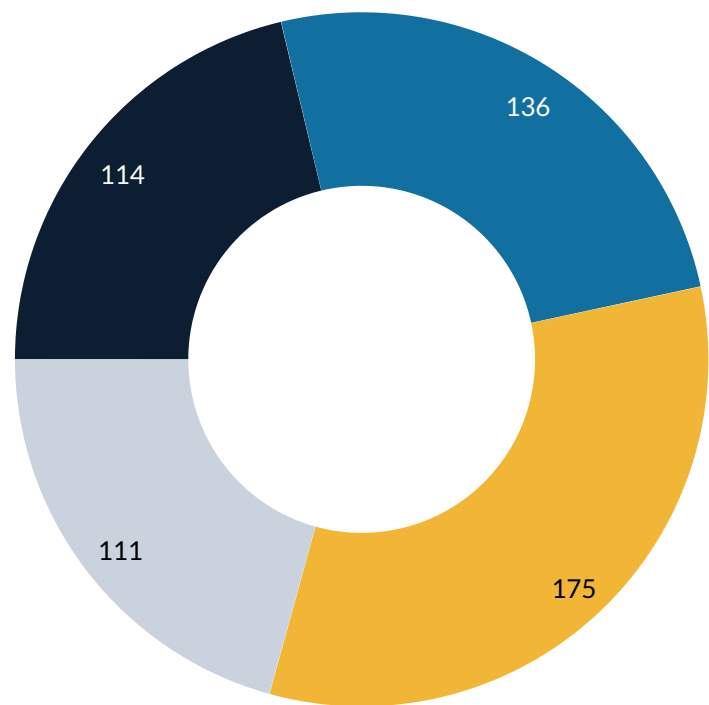

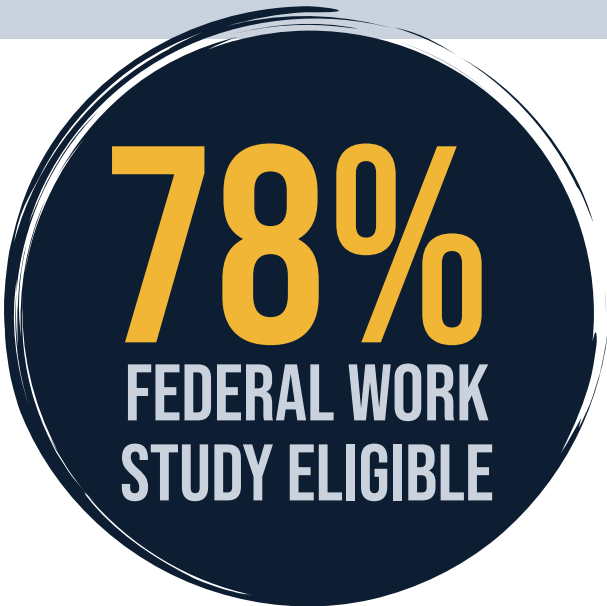
STUDENTS EMPLOYED THROUGH THE STUDENT EMPLOYMENT PROGRAM
