> **Students entering Salve Regina who have studied either French or Spanish take a web-based exam to determine their placement if they continue to study the same language. Students who place beyond the fourth semester are exempt from the language requirement. Students who place into the fourth semester need only take one semester of that language. All other students must complete two semesters of the same language.

Students who have studied languages other than French or Spanish for three or more years in high school and who wish to continue studying the same language are placed in intermediate-level courses.

Any student may choose to begin a language at the elementary level if they did not study that language in high school. Languages offered in the Fall semester include Arabic, French, Italian, Portuguese, and Spanish.
