

## Registration Guidelines for First-Year Business Majors Fall 2018

Full-time undergraduate students register for 12 to 17 credits per semester to earn 120 credits in eight semesters. First-year Business majors are advised to **register for the following**:

- **UNV101**, University Seminar I (3 credits) and **FYT100**, First Year Seminar (1 credit)  
(You will be automatically registered for FYT-100 because it is linked to your UNV-101 choice)
- **ECN101**, Macroeconomics (3 credits)
- **MGT120**, Management & Organizational Behavior (3 credits)
- One of the following major courses:
  - **ACC101 & ACC101L**, Financial Accounting and lab (4 credits)
  - **MGT280**, Principles of Marketing (recommended for marketing majors) (3 credits)
  - **APT103**, Internet & Computing Core Cert (3 credits) – **not required for Accounting majors**
- **One core course** (3 credits)
