Registration Guidelines for First-Year Undecided Majors Fall 2018

Full-time undergraduate students register for 12 to 17 credits per semester to earn 120 credits in eight semesters.

Undecided majors will be registered for discovery sections of UNV101 that will explore the community from various lenses. Undecided first-year students are advised to **register for the following**:

• Three or four core courses (9–13 credits). Students may select exploratory courses in place of core courses with guidance from their advisor during Orientation.
