- Support in the planning of FYT, Navigator, Portfolium, and Wellness programming
- Additional responsibilities as requested by the staff in the Center for Student Development
- Maintain electronic records of interactions with students
- Engage in private conversations with students and keep information confidential, as appropriate, within the Center for Student Development staff
- Attend scheduled activities, events, staff meetings, and meetings related to the program and the Center for Student Development Office as requested
